MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Oxfordshire County Council concessionary fares scheme

The concessionary fares scheme is part of a national scheme which provides free off-peak travel on local buses throughout England to people currently aged 60 and over, and eligible disabled people. Up to now, the scheme has been administered by the Vale of White Horse District Council, however the Government has decided that the responsibility should now sit with county councils. Therefore from 1st April 2011 Oxfordshire County Council will take over responsibility for concessionary bus passes, and it will create a common scheme for the whole of Oxfordshire. This will mean some changes

- A common 9.00 a.m. weekday start time is proposed
- Alternatives to the concessionary bus pass such as a Senior Rail Card or National Travel Tokens will not be offered.

The bus pass will not be eligible for use on dial-a-ride and door-to door community transport services. Passes for companions to enable disabled people who cannot travel independently to have assistance will continue. You can find further information http://myconsultations.oxfordshire.gov.uk Comments on the proposed changes can be left on the website or sent to Concessionary Fares Consultation, Freepost, Oxfordshire County Council (no further address required). The deadline for receipt of comments is Tues 14th December 2010.

North Street - Sewers

Residents may have noticed a large yellow lorry, equipped with hose reels and other machinery, in North Street. On enquiry, it transpired that the team was clearing out the main sewers, which as one operator said "had so much congealed fat in them you would think there were three restaurants in Marcham all going full tilt". Householders are reminded that waste cooking oils and fats should not be poured down the drain as they will solidify and block the main sewers. Spent oils and fats, when cold, may be put on a compost heap, or can be placed in the food waste bin. Larger quantities may be delivered to Dix Pit Recycling Centre at Stanton Harcourt, or may be collected by Green Fuels (tel: 0777 200 4474) who convert it into diesel fuel. Remember: a blocked main sewer means your drains won't run!
