

MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL

New Parish Councillor

The Parish Council, at its June meeting, was very pleased to welcome to the Council, Tetyana Rosenfeld as a new Member. She has lived in Abingdon for many years, but moved to a new house on the southern side of the village last year. She is passionate about the historical and environmental preservation of the local area. There are still some vacancies on the Council following the elections, so if anyone is interested in joining please contact the Clerk for further information and come and help shape the future of the area in which you live.

War Memorial - Grant

The Parish Council has now been awarded a grant from the War Memorial Trust towards the costs of conservation work at the war memorial. A local stone mason has been instructed to clean and repair the war memorial, and the work, which is very time consuming, should be carried out over the summer when the better weather is here. Oxfordshire County Council – sensitive street consultation

The County Council has a duty to co-ordinate road works across the county, and as part of that can designate streets as “traffic sensitive”, in order to better control the flow of traffic, and managing when works happens. The A415 and A338 are already listed, but new proposed additions have been identified by the County Council. These include North Street, the Faringdon Road leading through Gozzards Ford, Blackhorse Lane, and Cothill Roads. The Parish Council has asked for Howard Cornish Road to be included too.

New Play Facilities

Earlier this year, the Council set up a working party to look into play provision within the parish, to assess the open spaces and to see what might be needed by way of play equipment. Owing to the Summer holidays, the group has decided to hold its first meeting in September to begin thinking about this project. The working party, whilst including members of the Council may also include members of the public and/or stakeholders who have a particular link to or an interest in play provision. The Council has had some expressions of interest, but if you are interested in joining the group, and have not already contacted the clerk, or if you would like further information then please email or telephone the Clerk whose details are shown below.

Highways – Dumping of grass cuttings

The Parish Council has received reports of residents, after cutting their grass and trimming shrubs, dumping the clippings on the verges and in privately owned open areas. Please would residents keep the village tidy for the benefit of all, and dispose of grass cuttings either in the brown garden waste bin available from the Vale of White Horse District Council, or by taking them to the Drayton recycling centre.

Planning applications

The Parish Council has considered the following applications:

P19/V1168/HH Single storey rear conservatory at 8 Leas Lane. The Council had no objections.

P19/V1305/DIS Discharge of conditions for the Kings Field phase II development of 47 dwellings off Sheepstead Road. The Council, whilst not usually a formal consultee on applications for discharge of conditions, did resolve to comment on the proposed paths on the Eastern side of this development, as the drawings showed that they either linked with non-existent paths, or non-permanent paths.

In September 1979, just 9 months after it had started, MADNews was in the red! But luckily by the following month enough donations had been made to keep it going and a list was printed in December thanking those who had contributed: (some names are still well known to us!)

Mrs C Whild, Mr M Ballard, Mr R McKay, Mr Deverson, Mrs C Sewell, Mrs E Mott, Mrs D Mazey, Mrs S Brewer, Mr J McDonald, Mrs Palmer, Mr E Foster, Mr R Maton and many anonymous donations. The Ex-Servicemen's Club and PCC gave £30 each and the Boy's Football Team stumped up a fiver!

A good job too, as in February 1980 the duplicator needed repairs costing **£14.64!**

There was a cake decorating competition [won by Mrs Dore] and a garden-on-a-plate competition: winners 5-7 years – 1st Peter Dore, 2nd Alan Reed. 8-11 years – 1st Nicola Kelsh, 2nd Sharon Buddle. The winners of the egg-throwing competition were Kevin Buddle and Darren Butterworth. At the end of the day the school had raised £420.

MARCHAM CRICKET CLUB NEWS

Despite the weather, all matches have been played and completed. The first team have had a mixed month with two wins and two defeats, whilst the seconds have struggled with runs losing all three of their games. The details are:



First team

25 May – This was the start of things to come, with five of our top six batsmen being 15 years of age and under. A win at Broughton and North Newington was instrumented by an excellent 79 not out from young Oliver Deans. Broughton set a target of 151, having at one time being 85 for 8. Vice captain Mike Palmer took 4 wickets for 25 runs, whilst young Ethan Davie took 3 wickets with his spin for 37 runs. Neil Patel scored 32 in partnership with Deans, seeing us home with the loss of 6 wickets.

1 June – A second win on the trot as we defeated Radley at our `home venue` of Clifton Hampden. Setting a target of 187 all out, we defeated Radley by 27 runs. Ethan Davie scored a steady 44 along with 13 year old Kalan Niyarepola's contribution of 37. Young Ollie Armstrong opened the bowling, taking 4 wickets for 31 runs, including a triple wicket maiden. Three wickets in an over, without a run being scored! A feat which the likes of Ian Botham; Fred Trueman; and Freddie Flintoff probably never achieved! Any statisticians out there that can remember these names, may put the author right or otherwise! It was an `Armstrong day`, as dad Stuart also took 3 wickets for 21 runs.

8 June – A close game at bottom club Dorchester saw us lose an exciting game by one wicket. A low scoring game saw us set 102 as a total, with Stuart Armstrong scoring 35 not out. Oliver Deans opened the bowling taking four wickets for 31 runs, including a hat-trick (three wickets in three consecutive balls). Stuart Armstrong's `googlies` and other `spinning stuff`, with 3 wickets for 15 runs almost grasped an unlikely win, but the hosts scored 105 for 9, winning a close, but enjoyable game.

15 June – A wet day, and therefore damp wicket at Clifton, saw us bowled out cheaply by leaders Hook Norton for 73 runs. They recorded their seventh consecutive league win, scoring the runs required for the loss of just two wickets.

Second Team

25 May – A close game at our `home` venue of Freeland against Harwell Interanational saw us lose a game that afterwards in the pub we felt we should have won! Steve Hill top scored with 41, as we totalled a below par 135 for 7. Early wickets, especially by Andy Chalmers, who took 4 for 27, promised much, but unfortunately the visitors had a `hitter` who sent us to `The Yeoman` for a `drowning our sorrows` drink, rather than a celebratory one! Young Arthur Warwick made a very promising debut, including a glorious straight drive for 4 runs and covering fielders that are at least four times his age!

1 June – Another disappointing result, batting first, scoring just 92 against Wootton and Boars Hill. Richard Wightman, playing his first game for two years, top scored, batting low in the order, with 34 not out. Five `ducks` were recorded, and not a wet day! Wootton scored the required runs for the loss of just three wickets.

15 June – When we thought it could not get any worse, we were defeated by bottom of the table Bampton. A total of 55 was never going to win a game of cricket, though Adam Grady took three quick wickets, meaning Bampton did lose five wickets before scoring the required 56 runs.



Behaviours, Systems and Processes



Flaming June arrived on schedule this year – well, it's flaming to me, as anything over 18 degrees is too hot for my liking!

For many of the plants we grow in our gardens, it's a struggle too. With some showing signs of not liking the changing weather patterns we now face in the UK, as a climate crisis seems to be heading our way.

My view of the climate emergency we face is that climate change is a naturally occurring phenomenon, which in some ways is worsened and sped up by human behaviours, systems and processes, which we can all feel locked into.

Lots of people talk about slowing down or even reversing climate change. We need to choose our battles wisely, and I for one, would like to see the focus switched across to the art of adapting to whatever nature throws at us. Whether that's humanity's survival thousands of years into the future, not just a few generations hence. Or just that we start to live better, simpler and more sustainable lives. I say simpler, not easier. I think trying to make our lives easier has led us up the garden path as it were.

The adapting process can start in our own gardens. The plants I said that appear to be struggling in the gardens I get to see, because it's too wet in winter or too hot in summer. We potentially need to adapt our planting to accommodate the conditions. Something us gardeners do quite naturally anyway.

Longtermism of thought relates to gardens as well as the wider environment. So how will you adapt your garden going forward? Will UK gardens and the concept of them look very different in years to come?

Affinity Water joins forces with Thames Water

Affinity Water, another water supplier outside our region, have published a revised draft water management plan, which shows a joint proposal with Thames Water to deliver a 150million cubic metre reservoir between Drayton, East Hanney, Steventon and Marcham. It intends to syphon off water from this reservoir mainly to supply large areas north and west of London.

The Vale has strongly questioned the need for such a reservoir and whether it is the appropriate solution for the south east. Also, it has recommended that a public enquiry be held, similar to its response to Thames Water's draft management plan, to examine the draft plan, to ensure that correct procedures have been followed and that each option has been fully assessed and explored in an appropriate level of detail. COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Growth. – good thing or bad thing?

Oxfordshire has grown spectacularly over the past few decades with more houses, more jobs, fewer people in poverty, and an increased standard of living for most.

But at what cost? Reducing air quality, increasing congestion and the gap between rich and poor increasing. So is the economic growth that has given us all this a good or a bad thing?

It seems that it depends on what we mean by economic growth. If we mean, that in order to increase prosperity, there is no alternative to spreading ourselves further and gobbling up the earth's resources ever faster, then the growing concerns over congestion, plastic and air pollution would suggest that we need to think carefully before we go for "growth at all costs". I am no economist, but I understand that there is economic growth in science and technology allowing us to do things ever more efficiently. Such growth need not involve increasing consumption of the earth's resources, we simply get more and more for our money by using resources more efficiently. And there is no evidence that the process is finite.

Somewhere, in all that, there might be an answer in how to

continue growing whilst reducing pollution, reducing congestion and reducing poverty. Perhaps we need to redefine what we mean by "growth".

"The Growth Board" (made up of Council Leaders and others) has received some bad press for seeming to be entirely about growth at all costs, more roads, more traffic and more pollution. Along with "The Growth Deal" (the agreement with Government to deliver 100,000 houses by 2030 in return for a contribution towards the cost of extra infrastructure), the Growth Board is seen as part of a relentless drive to destroy the County. If we were to redefine what we mean by "growth", some of the potential benefits of the Growth Board might be more apparent. Getting Leaders of all Oxfordshire Councils together to address common problems and find common solutions should be a good thing. It would encourage joint planning of Oxfordshire's housing, a joint approach to the Green Belt and be a bigger voice with government than our six competing Councils are able to achieve currently.




In 2019, after consultation with the farm, the routes of some of the paths were altered and last month, another working party erected signs to show where you can walk on the new paths.

If 80% of residents use and register Smartwater, a sign can be displayed at the end of your street as well as stickers in house windows. Beware of Doorstep Scammers

Rogue doorstep traders often take advantage of the warmer weather to offer home improvement services including gardening, window cleaning and gutter clearing. They will repeatedly offer their services at attractive rates and use persuasive and persistent sales techniques to encourage people into making rushed decisions. Scammers may conduct surveys just to get your personal details or as a cover to sell you goods or services you don't want or need.

- If someone knocks at your front door claiming to be from a company, first check their ID. If you're not happy, don't let them in.
- Never call the phone number on their ID card to check them out. Ask the salesperson to wait outside, shut the door and find the company number on the internet. If they're genuine, they'll understand.

- Never disclose your bank details.
