





MARCHAM PARISH COUNCIL**Oxfordshire County Council Consultation – Reduction of Speed limit A415**

The Parish Council has requested a reduction in the speed limit along the A415 from the village to the A34 interchange. The proposal is to reduce it from 60mph to 50mph, and this should be extremely helpful for the pedestrians and cyclists who use the footway, with traffic travelling past at slower speeds. The County Council is seeking comments on the proposal to reduce the speed limit, and your views can be logged before 6th December at <https://consultations.oxfordshire.gov.uk/consult.ti/MarchamA41550mph/consultationHome>

Christmas Tree Recycling

For those of you who have real Christmas trees, and are signed up to the District Council's garden waste service, your trees, when you no longer need them, can be put out next to the brown bin provided they are less than 6ft or 1.8m. They need to be cut into sections if taller than this. If you do not have a brown garden waste bin, then your real Christmas tree can be placed by the Salvation Army Textile bank in Howard Cornish Road (opposite Duffield Place), or taken to Millets Farm Garden Centre, and the District Council will pick them up for composting. The collection from Marcham will be on Thursday 9th January, so all Christmas Trees will need to be by the textile bank by the end of the day on Wednesday 8th January, 2020, or by Saturday 11th January if you are taking it to Millets Farm.

Parishioner of the Year Award

The Parish Council is again inviting nominations for the Parishioner of the Year Award. This is to recognise the efforts of local people from anywhere within the parish who have contributed to local community life. Marcham Parish covers the wide area from the A420 in the north to the River Ock in the South and from the A338 in the West across to and including most of Gozzards Ford in the East. The Council gives the award to anyone who, at any time, has significantly voluntarily contributed to life within the parish. The certificate is presented at the annual meeting for electors each year. 



DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT**Purdah and the election**

As we are now in that peculiar period before an election called *Purdah*, we, as district councillors at the Vale, are heavily restricted with what we can do or say. Nothing political is allowed when wearing our councillor's hat! So, I thought I would update you on some useful information.

Firstly, your poll cards and postal packs. So long as you registered to vote by 26th November, you will receive your poll cards by 6th December. For those who applied for a postal vote before the 8th November, postal packs will be posted on 26th November; those who applied between the 8th and 26th November will receive their packs between 3rd and 6th December. If you haven't received your pack by then you need to ring 01235 422528 to request a replacement. If you need a proxy vote you need to apply before 4th December.

I am happy to report that the Vale has arranged for the polling station to be in Denman College instead of the Baptist Hall, which many people found very difficult to access.

Request for help to reach EU Nationals

At the last full Council meeting, a motion was passed to help EU nationals understand exactly where they stand and what they can do to remain in the UK after Brexit, as well as to let them know how the Council want to support them. Thousands of letters were sent out to EU residents in the South and Vale Districts, but for data protection reasons not all relevant residents were reached. A Life-saving App

A new potentially life-saving app can tell emergency services the precise location they need to go to when someone needs assistance and Thames Valley Police is recommending everybody installs it on their smartphone. What3words divides the entire globe into 57 trillion 3m x 3m squares – if someone needs assistance it will then provide a specific three-word code for where they are, making it a lot easier for the emergency services to find someone in a rural area or unfamiliar location. The app, which is used by emergency services across the country, is free and doesn't require an internet connection to use – for more information please see the what3words website what3words.com

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT**Expressway**

Much is made of the idea of the Oxford-Cambridge 'Arc'. For some, it represents the future for Oxfordshire, presenting an opportunity for increased economic growth, based on the established 'knowledge spine' and reputations of the two universities, and our centres of scientific research. To others, it represents a threat to rurality and the climate - with a potential Expressway linking the area paid for by vast quantities of extra housing.

But the 'Arc' is, in reality, simply an idea. As a major net contributor to the national exchequer, the idea of stimulating further growth in the area and attracting further investment, is hard to argue against. This does not necessarily mean that an Expressway is inevitable, however. Indeed, several of Oxfordshire's Councils have come out firmly against the Expressway. The latest of these is the County Council itself, who, in November, passed a motion rejecting the idea outright - 'whatever the route' and a letter was sent to Highways England to that effect.

It is argued that connecting up the Arc could be done just as effectively (and at much lower cost) by improving and completing the East West Rail link provision. It is also argued that the carbon output in building the new road would make achieving our reduction targets almost impossible. It seems that this is going to become a major bun fight in the next few months.

The School Run

We are all noticing just how stressed our local road system is at present. The 10 mile journey from Drayton to Oxford can take 90 minutes at some times of the day. Yet at half terms and school holidays, it can be done in under 30 minutes. There are daily tailbacks at Culham Bridge and around Frilford crossroads. Major congestion caused by roadworks and accidents somewhere in the system are increasingly common. And even the rat runs are becoming congested. School Travel Plans have been around for many years, but clearly, something more is needed. And spare a thought for parents trying to get their children to school on time when bus services are often not good enough. Not much wonder that many parents are prepared to risk the wrath (and these days the possible financial consequences) of taking children out of school in term time. Is it possible that the solution lies in the coming together of the education system, our transport bodies and even the travel industry? – variable term times? – variable starts to the school day? There is certainly a need for some fresh thinking.

And please vote.

If you are reading this before December 12th, please make sure that you remember to exercise your democratic right and cast your vote. Then have a very Happy Christmas and New Year.

CITIZENS ADVICE FOR EU CITIZENS

Apply now for right to remain in UK

If you are a European Union citizen living or working in the UK, you might be wondering what will happen when the United Kingdom leaves the EU and what you should do so that you have the right to remain in this country.

The government has set up a programme called the EU Settlement Scheme which is intended for you. There is no charge for applying to this scheme. Citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland can also apply. It is important that you apply NOW, without waiting until the UK actually leaves. You can begin the process here: <https://www.gov.uk/settled-status-eu-citizens-families/applying-for-settled-status>

If your application is successful you will be able to continue living in the UK after 30 June 2021. You will also have the right to work in the UK, use the National Health Service, get access to benefits and pensions if you are eligible, and travel in and out of the country. There is more information about your rights on the government website.

The new deadline for the UK to leave the EU is 31 January 2020 but it is still unclear exactly how it will take place, especially in view of the general election in December.

If the UK leaves the EU without a deal, you will need to be living in the UK BEFORE it leaves the EU in order to apply. Check the Citizens Advice website at: <https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/immigration/staying-in-the-uk-after-brexit>



Anti-social behaviour (ASB): Following an increase in reports of ASB, the neighbourhood team have drawn up several Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs) for the young people involved. The contracts are designed to help the young people think about their behaviour, any breaches are then recorded and further work carried out if necessary. Home visits have also been carried out along with letters to parents to address the poor behaviour.

The victim then ran away and was assaulted again by a second boy on Tower Close. The victim was punched multiple times in the face resulting in a broken nose. County Drugs Lines (CDL)

County Drugs Lines is when organised crime groups exploit children and vulnerable adults to move and store the drugs and money and

they will often use coercion, intimidation, violence (including sexual violence) and weapons. PCSO Moquet and PCSO Wright visited hotels around Abingdon to give advice on this. The hotels were educated on the suspicious behaviour to look out for and how to deal with it and report it if they suspect that this is happening in their hotels.

Offenders brought to justice

- A male was arrested and charged with two counts of criminal damage after he caused damage to two vehicles that were parked in West St Helen St on Thursday 31st October. The male has been bailed and is due to attend court in a few weeks' time.
- On Wednesday 16th October a male was arrested after being found by PCSOs to be in breach of his Community Behaviour Order by being in Abingdon and drinking alcohol. The male was charged and remanded to prison for 56 days.
- On 14th October a car was stolen from Hawkins Way, Wootton. On the 15 October a male was arrested and charged with this offence and other offences.

Stolen bikes

PCSO Moquet and PCSO Wright seized approximately £10,000 worth of suspected stolen bikes from an address in Abingdon. We are currently investigating the thefts and have already re-united some of the bikes with their rightful owners. It is important to report it if you have a bike stolen so if it's recovered we can get it back to you. Take photos of your bikes, take down frame numbers and security mark/register them.

Abingdon Street Pastors

On Friday 5th October, the neighbourhood team were invited to attend a meeting with the Abingdon Street Pastors. The Street Pastors were recently given a donation of money by Thames Valley Police from the 'Police Property Act' fund and attended a ceremony at Sulhamstead. The neighbourhood team have worked closely with the Street Pastors, who care for, listen to and talk with people on the streets of Abingdon at night, for several years. The Street Pastors offer help to individuals by providing practical assistance if required and help to keep people safe until they return home. How to reduce the risk of becoming a burglary victim this Christmas

The Christmas and New Year period is a time when Thames Valley Police, and other forces around the country, experience an increase in residential burglary.

If you are celebrating at home over Christmas or at New Year, you can help to protect your property by taking a few simple steps:

- Don't leave presents on view under the Christmas tree.
- Cut up packaging for any expensive items so that it will fit inside your refuse bin, never leave boxes next to the bin where they can be seen.
- Remember to mark your valuables using a UV pen and register them on the national property register at www.immobilise.com.
- If you are going away, you can deter burglars by making your home appear occupied:
- Double check that you have locked your windows and doors before leaving.
- Light up your living room using timer switch. A TV simulator can also be used to make give the appearance of a TV screen being used.
- Invite a neighbour to park on your drive while you are away.

Dear Friends,

I wonder how you would sum up what Christmas means?

'Just for the children', 'a reason for a good party', 'an extravagant expense', 'not sure'?

At heart the celebration is about real events in real time. Yes, we may not be quite sure of exact dates for those events, but those events took place, and the 'unpacking' of what was going on has been thought about and debated ever since.

In some ways the world at the time of the birth of Jesus wasn't so very different from the world we know today - the political scene was in turmoil, there were international tensions, there was a lot of social unrest. And it was into that world that Christ came - a hurting, broken, stressed world, where human cruelty was commonplace under an oppressive foreign power.

"Why did he come?" we might ask. The answer, from a Christian perspective, would be along the lines "He came to make a world of a difference, to demonstrate the presence and reality of God, and to effect reconciliation between God and humankind." His coming demonstrated that God continues to care for the world, and for us, as faltering, flawed human beings.

Over the centuries since his birth, the Christian Church has celebrated this pivotal moment in history. And there are many people today, from all walks of life and ethnic backgrounds, who know for themselves the real difference that Jesus Christ makes in daily life. Being in touch with God amid that strains and stresses of our fast-moving and changing world, is both wonderful and challenging.

What motivated God to send his Son into the world? The simple, and most profound answer is 'love' - love for each of us, love that flows from his heart to our hearts, the love of his living Being to us as living beings, of love of being in touch in the frequently tough and ever-changing circumstances of life, and so that you and I might know that he loves us, that we are on his heart.

I was recently talking with a couple who mentioned that it was when they verbally expressed their gratitude to God for his love in Jesus, and asking him to come and be real in their experience, that their lives were changed by his presence. Have you done a similar thing? 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in...' said Jesus. [Revelation 3:20]

I hope you and those you love enjoy very special Christmas this year. The greatest gift is Christ himself - 'the reason for the season'. I hope you can find a quiet moment in the 'much-doing' to verbalise your own gratitude to God, and to receive Christ into your own life.
